

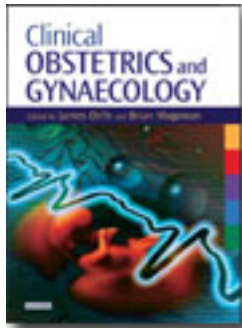

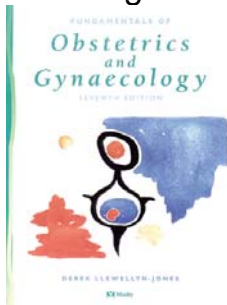


2. Llewellyn-Jones Fundamentals of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (8th edition)

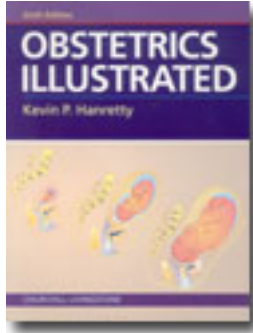


3. Obstetrics Illustrated (6th edition)

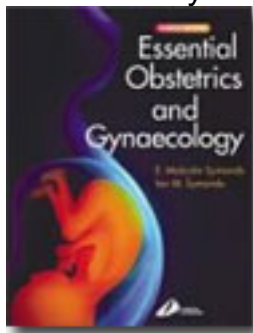
This new edition stresses what is important and relevant in contemporary gynaecology and the emphasis on visual presentation, where possible, has been maintained.

This new edition integrates basic clinical sciences with clinical material to aid the thorough understanding of the underlying disease processes essential for undergraduates.

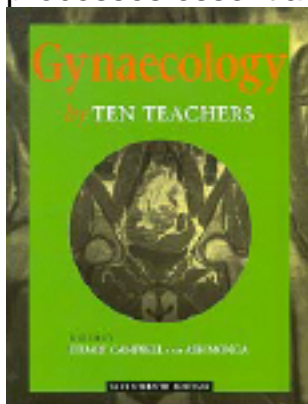
8. Gynaecology by Ten Teachers (17th edition)
